Q. Where is the Alsip Boat Launch?

A. The Alsip Boat Launch, also known as Howes Landing, is located off 127th St and Laramie at 5399 W Plattner Drive, Alsip

Q. What time is the event?

A. The event will be from 10 to 1PM, April 28, 2018

Q. Will the event be postponed if it's raining?

A. While we hope for a beautiful, sunny Spring Day we can't control the weather. If there is no lightening or other potentially dangerous hazards, the event will go on rain or shine. We cannot guarantee our community partners will stay, but shredding, textiles, pharmaceuticals, and e-waste collection will still be available.

Q. I can't make it during the event hours. Can I drop items off at the Boat Launch before the event?
 A. No. Please do not leave anything by the Boat Launch before or after the event. If you need assistance with finding the appropriate place to donate your items on another date, please contact the Village of Alsip .

# There is no charge for the following items:

- Used/New Hearing aids provided by Sertoma Center
- Used/New Eyeglasses provided by Lions Club
- Textiles by AmVet (shoes, clothes, towels, bags, purses, belts, etc.)
- Paper and Cardboard by Midwest Paper Retriever (clean paper and cardboard to be recycled into other paper products)

- Unused, original packaging Toiletries by RespondNow (toilet paper, [shampoo, conditioner, soap/body wash, body lotion hotel size ok] razors, deodorant for both men & women, pads, tampons, diapers, baby wipes, adult diapers)
- Unwanted Pharmaceuticals by the Village of Alsip Police Department (all medicines except liquids and needles)

A. Yes! Volunteers from Hamlin Upper Grade Center, District 125 and the Junior High Eco Club of District 126 will be on hand to help.

### E-Waste Details for Acceptable and Non-Acceptable Items

\*\*Unfortunately, due to some legislative changes and intensity of recycling certain items, costs may apply. Please continue reading for those items that will incur a cost. All fees are in cash only and paid on-site.\*\*

Acceptable Office equipment (no charge):

- Office / home phones
- Cell phones (with or without the battery)

- Computer wire and cords
- Laptops (with or without the battery)
- Desktop computers (CPU)
- Hard Drives
- Modems
- Servers
- Speakers

## <u>Acceptable Household Items – no charge (if items are in working condition, consider dropping them off to the</u> <u>AMVET truck):</u>

- Radio/Stereo
- DVD/VCR Player (NO DVD/CD or TAPES)
- Games console (NO GAMES)

## The following COST ITEMS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED UNTIL CASH FEE HAS BEEN RECEIVED

FEES:

- CRT (computer monitor)
- Television (w/or w/o rear projection)
- LCD /Plasma TV's
  - Up to 32" = \$15/each
  - Between 32"-52" = \$25/each
- Large, console TV's (typically in wooden frame or larger than 52")
  - o = \$35/each

\*Limit 2 per household

### REFUSED/UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR E-WASTE

Consumer Electronics for example:

- dishwashers
- refrigerators
- a/c units
- microwaves

The following are unacceptable by E-WASTE, if still working <u>AMVET</u> will receive them

- vacuum's
- coffee makers/ pots
- food blenders

FYI: Donating all items containing hard drives or other forms of memory storage devises at this public electronic drop off event does guarantee destruction of said devise, requested or not.
