ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT UPDATES

Opus Development constructed (2) two new 190,000 square foot logistic facilities at 118th & Mayfield to the Tri-state expressway. This massive expansion includes a new frontage road adjacent to the expressway from Central Ave. to Austin Ave. Well done!

These two massive structures and many others now occupy what used to be vacant, wooded, or blighted property that did not help Alsip taxpayers and are now part of a very strong tax base supporting the Village of Alsip, the schools, park district and library.





Principle Contractors did a great job constructing this new logistics facility at the eastern gateway to the Village at 3600 W 127th St and is now home to 4D Logistics. This development eliminated (3) decades of vacant land.



Quick Run convenience store brought Shell gasoline products with them and eliminated a decade of blight at 115th & Cicero. This is a very nice store and compliments this very busy intersection.

The Village has facilitated almost \$300 million of new and expanded development over the past (8) eight years, because many businesses follow businesses when they identify a growing community with great services and personnel, as they have choices and they choose Alsip!

Early Voting 2024



THE LAST DAY FOR YARD WASTE PICKUP WILL BE FRIDAY NOVEMBER 24TH

IF YOU HAVE A BROWN YARD WASTE TOTE FROM REPUBLIC, YOU MAY USE IT FOR REGULAR GARBAGE AFTER DECEMBER 1ST



Yard Waste services are provided by **Republic Services** and will be collected on *Fridays from April 1st until November 30th.* Landscape waste (grass, leaves, branches, brush and other vegetative waste, excluding dirt, clay or other inorganic material) must not be mixed with garbage. Yard waste needs to be placed in a yard waste bag or an appropriately labeled container not to exceed 33-gallon capacity and must not exceed fifty (50) pounds. Tree and shrub trimmings shall be tied and in bundles not exceeding fifty (50) pounds and forty-one (41") in length. Yard waste may not be placed in plastic bags, drums, or fiber drums.

Camera Registration

We are building an interactive map of security cameras in Alsip that will:

- Increase the efficiency of direct video evidence collection.

Update from the Fire Department

I can't believe I am already writing the fall article for 2024. It seems like the fall 2023 article just came out. Another very quick year going by. Welcome to fall and soon winter.

With that being said, we at the Alsip Fire Department are always being challenged on a continuous basis, whether it's from replacing older

equipment with new (good news later about that), the ever changing world of technology of all sorts, firefighters retiring and filling those spots, to the increase of our call volume. It doesn't stop. However, we face the challenges head on work on solutions to manage them. Thus, maintaining the service needed to keep providing top notch service to our residents, businesses and travelers through our village.

This year we had 3 firefighters retire: FF John Cortilet retired in May, Lt. Hufnagl retired in June and FF Bruder retired in August. All 3 were hired in 1997 and had a great career with us. We wish them a happy and healthy retirement.





Since the last article, we have also hired 3 new firefighters: FF Alex Kieruzel stated in March this year and FFs Tim Wunderlich and Scott Rybka started in August this year. We welcome all 3 to our family here at Alsip. On September 11th FF Colin Young completed his 1-year probation and



repeated the oath of office during a ceremony at Fire Station 1. Since last spring, we also hired Ana Prieto as our new Fire Prevention Bureau Administrative

Assistant who replaced Danielle Tyma who is our new Administrative Assistant All great stuff. Hopefully by the next newsletter, I can report that we have hired 2 additional firefighters to complete our staffing level.



On October 12th, we will have hosted our annual open house. Over the past 10 years our open houses have been very successful and very well attended. In

2023, over 700 people attended our open house (best guess). Our Public Education Coordinators (Lt. Rick Kraus and FF/PM Charlie Harding) do an excellent job putting

together the program. As we move forward, both of them are continuing to look at enforcing and creating new programs for our Community Risk Reduction programs including home inspections (voluntary) and installing 10 year smoke detectors.



This year we are focusing on lithium ion batteries and equipment that use them. With the current trend of devices we have seen an incredible amount of devices that use these batteries now including e-bikes and mobility devices. We now have equipment to help mitigate those incidents if the occasion arises. If you have any type of e-bike or mobility, do not store or charge the unit between you and your means of exit. Too often we hear of devices that start on fire when charging and the occupants have a difficult exiting because the devices are between them and the way out. To show how quickly these devices go up, Google either e-bike fires or battery scooter fires. It is scary to see what those hazards are.

We have some new coming equipment in the very near future. By the time you receive this. am hoping take delivery of our pumper truck by manufactured Seagrave. We also have a new midmount tower ladder on order we should see next June or so.





This replaced our 2002 ladder truck that was removed from service on June 27th due to frame issues. The tower ladder is being manufactured by Rosenbauer out of Wyoming Minnesota. The original ladder truck for Alsip was also a mid-mount tower ladder. For the type of village, we have with both our business community and apartment buildings, a mid-mount tower ladder is by far the best choice of ladder truck to have. It is very versatile and can

perform many more functions more efficiently than our past ladder truck. And lastly, we have a new ambulance on order manufactured by Road Rescue our of Winter Park Florida. It looks exactly the same as our current ambulances. It should arrive between May and June of 2025. All of this is extremely exciting and will help provide more effective and efficient services by your fire department.

As always, the Alsip Fire Department is always here for you. We will continue to provide the best possible service, whether it be EMS, fire or any other type of incident. We continue to evaluate new equipment and techniques to serve you better. One of the newest challenges is lithium batteries. Even though these batteries have been out for a few years, production and use are multiplying quickly from simple things as scooters or bikes to vehicles. They pose very challenging problems for fire departments and are difficult at best to mitigate. We are now looking at new techniques and equipment to help take care of the problem.

Also, as the sun is going down earlier, we know winter is approaching, or at least should be. We have Thanksgiving and Christmas coming up. With these 2 holidays comes our busier season. Be very mindful of safety concerns whether you are cooking your turkey in a deep fryer (many you tube videos on what not to do) to overloading your outlets with holiday lights. LED lights are great because they use less energy, however, that doesn't mean you can keep plugging more into the same outlet (as seen in the movie Christmas Vacation). If you have a real Christmas tree, keep it watered. At the end of the season when it is dried out, move away from any structures. They combust very easily and go up quick.

If you use a space heater for your home, keep it away from other combustibles (clothes, bedding, etc). if possible, use water type heaters instead. They are safer, but a little more expensive. Make sure you have at least 1 smoke detector for each level of your home. Ideally, 1 in each bedroom. By now everyone should have replaced their old smoke detectors with the new, 10-year smoke detectors. If you have smoke detectors that are older than 10-year-old (the date code is on the back), more than likely, they will not detect some due to the element inside having a shelf life of 10 years. It still might chirp when pushing the test button but that just means the battery is good.

Be sure to have at least 1 carbon monoxide detector in your home. The type with the display is preferred so if it activates, the level will be displayed. Have it installed in the sleeping area of your home so it can wake you up at night. Carbon monoxide is a light gas so it will rise. Your detector should be mounted high on a wall.

All of us at the Alsip Fire Department wish all of you and your families a happy remainder of 2024 and upcoming 2025. We are here to serve you!!

Updates from the Public Works Department

Over the next few months, we have a number of projects that will be performed such as Road Resurfacing, Sewer Cleaning & Televising and Removal of severally dead and infested parkway trees. So please be patient if you come across these projects but the outcome will be well worth it.

We will be resurfacing the following roads in town: 115th PI from Joalyce Dr to Kolin Ave, 44th Ct from 115th PI to 115th St, 118th St from Kostner Ave to Kolin Ave, Kolin Ave/118th PI from 118th St to Tripp Ave, Tripp Ave

from 119th St to 118th Pl, Fey Ln from Cul de sac to Kolin Ave, Kedvale Ave from 118th Pl to 117th St, JoBev Ln from 118th Pl to Cul de sac, Keeler Ave from 120th St to 119th Pl and 120th St from Keeler Ave to Pulaski Rd.

The Village of Alsip was awarded a grant from the Safe Routes to School program. This funding allowed the Village to install & connect new sidewalks to Hazelgreen and Prairie Jr. High School and provide a safer passage for pedestrians.









Kostner Avenue between 123rd St & 127th St was recently resurfaced. This project was funded through Federal Surface Transportation Program and Motor Fuel Tax.

Seasonal Reminders . . .

Autumn Leaves

Please remember do not rake leaves into the street. Leaves can block sewers and lead to flooding. Place leaves in a yard waste bag or container and put out with your regular garbage pickup.



Winter Snow Plow Parking Restrictions

Residents are asked to promptly remove vehicles from village streets at the start of a snow fall. Vehicles are subject to ticketing and towing after a 1" accumulation on marked primary routes and 3" on secondary routes (secondary routes are not marked).

Also, please do not push snow back onto the street as it is unlawful to do so after the street has been plowed. Some snow will overflow onto driveways and sidewalks as part of the plowing process; your understanding of this matter is appreciated.

Snow Removal Suggestions

An unavoidable result of plowing roadways is that some snow will spill off from the plow blade into driveways. The Alsip Public Works understands how frustrating this can be, especially when residents have already cleared the ends of their drives. The department suggests waiting until the plow trucks have made their final pass along the curb line before shoveling. Information pertaining to the plow driver's status in your area can be obtained by contacting the Alsip Public Works at 708-385-6902 x2364 during normal business hours (8am – 4:30pm).

If you cannot wait for the plow truck to make its final pass, the following suggestions are offered as a way to reduce the amount of snow overflowing onto the end of your drive:

- Shovel snow at the end of your driveway onto the parkway to the right (when facing the street). This will help to reduce the amount of snow deposited as the plow truck passes by.
- Clear a portion of the roadway directly to the left of your drive (when facing the street). This will also help to reduce the amount of snow deposited as the plow truck passes by.
- Not depositing snow from your driveway into the roadway will also help to reduce the amount of snow that could be plowed onto your drive.

Rodent Control and Public Health

Rodents (rats/mice) can be a serious problem for residents. The below information can help you identify, control, and eliminate them. Rodents have a tremendous ability to adapt to their environment and quickly reproduce. Rodents have been associated with carrying many diseases that can affect humans and animals.



SIGNS YOU MAY HAVE A RODENT PROBLEM . . .



GNAWING: Chewed areas around doors, windows, utility lines and

packaged goods, especially where food is kept.

BURROWS: Holes and fresh diggings around foundations, under floors,

sidewalks, platforms and ditches.

DROPPINGS: Fresh droppings are a sure sign that you have a rat problem.

Look behind objects, near walls, and in places seldom cleaned

or disturbed.

TRACKS: Tracks in dusty places. If not visible, dust flour along suspected

runways and observe for a few days.

SMEARS: When rats travel, they rub against walls to find their way.

Look for darkened areas along walls next to pipes, beams

and openings where rats are suspected.

TIPS TO PREVENT RODENT PROBLEMS

REMOVE WATER:

- Make sure outside faucets are turned off and are not leaking.
- Control areas with standing water.
- Do not leave water bowls outside for pets.
- Check for leaking water pipes or faucets.
- Remove any water standing in the basement.

REMOVE FOOD:

- Remove food scraps spilled around trash containers.
- Do not dispose of garbage in boxes, paper bags, or in garbage cans without lids.
- Dispose of food on the stove or on tables between meals.
- Do not leave pet food out overnight/outdoors.
- Make sure to remove all pet feces.

REMOVE SHELTER:

- Do not allow trash to accumulate in yards and alleys.
- Cut all high weed, tall grass, and unkempt bushes.
- Do not store firewood against buildings.
- Keep doors closed when not in use.
- Close all holes in walls, foundations, floors, and around pipes with cement and sheet metal.
- Get rid of unneeded items stored in basements, cellars, or attics.
