

## **Update to Vehicle Sticker Sales**

Due to the hardships to families attributed to Covid 19 and our office being closed to the public, Mayor Ryan requested Village Trustees to extend compliance for Village Vehicle Stickers. The vote was approved for the extension to August 1st. Everyone can still purchase stickers online, or through the mail by check.

The Mayor and Village Board agreed to discount Vehicle Stickers for One Active/Reserve Military or Veteran. Residents between the ages of

18 and 62, shall be permitted one vehicle license for a passenger vehicle or a Class B vehicle at a cost of \$5.00. To be eligible for the exemption the applicant shall present a valid driver's license and proof for Active/Reserve using CAC cards. Veteran status can be determined using Department of Defense (DD-2 form for retirees)

(DD 2765 form) for Privileged Veterans. Veterans have also been able to get an updated driver's license/ID card with the "VETERAN" under the signature on the front of the card, or (VIC) Veterans Identification Card is acceptable.

Also new this year, if you have previously purchased a discounted vehicle sticker as a senior or disabled resident, you can now mail in your payment with the completed form or online by visiting www.villageofalsip.org and click on the top toolbar where

it says "Pay Water/Vehicle Sticker". You will no longer need to come to the Village Hall in person to get your vehicle sticker.



Only one vehicle sticker per household shall be eligible for the discounted vehicle license be that senior, disabled or military/veteran.

Now, this public health crisis triggered a massive economic disruption, please know we'll need to make difficult decisions necessary for responsible spending. The reduction of revenues to the country, forced the State of Illinois' general revenue funds to be revised down \$2.7 billion in 2020 and \$4.6 billion in fiscal year 2021. This means Alsip's budget will

"We'll budget within our means, but we won't sacrifice or reduce your Village services." need to be reduced as well and the revised budget I'm submitting, will eliminate most new purchases for all Village services and a muchneeded asphalt replacement for all Village properties. Alsip must reduce its

spending and anticipate less revenues next year. The Board of Trustees will qualify and approve a reduced 2021 budget.

Lastly, please be optimistic and try to look forward to better times, as around the world, everything has changed. Everyone sympathizes with students/teachers who couldn't finish the schoolyear, or participate in proms, or graduation ceremonies, soon friends & family will acknowledge your accomplishments. Travel, birthdays, bbg's, sports, day camps, band, dance, social events and even sitting down at your favorite restaurant or pub has been compromised, but we'll be ok and we'll remember what working together really meant, because we're blessed to have great services and resources in Alsip. Please take care of yourself and look after each other, especially the senior citizens, as many people are very proud and won't ask for help, so volunteer it, as you know to do what's right in your heart.

The Village of Alsip is proud to offer this program to honor current or former residents of Alsip who have served or are currently serving our country in a branch of the military.


Individuals to be recognized must be a current or former resident of Alsip, and must have served in any of the following branches of service:

## COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT



The program incorporates lifesaving and decision-making skills in order to decrease injury and mortality: providing help when an unplanned disastrous event unfolds which has the potential to overwhelm the existing response capability. Volunteers focused on disaster preparedness, practiced fire suppression, emergency operations, basic search and rescue techniques, organizing resources, basic medical operations, how to use a fire extinguisher and basic damage assessment.

The CERT program is part of a nationwide effort to empower citizens in preparedness and response to major emergencies. - Branches should be placed out no sooner than 4:00 p.m. on the day preceding your first scheduled pick-up day.
- Residents that remove a tree themselves MUST contact Public Works to schedule a pickup.



## **Future City Team**

The Future City Competition is a national, project-based learning experience where middle school students imagine, design, and build a city of the future. This cross-curricular educational program integrates science, technology, engineering, art, math, and writing. In addition, the program teaches real-world skills such as team collaboration, research, and communication.

This year's theme was "CLEAN WATER: Tap Into Tomorrow." The theme challenged students to choose a threat to their future city's water supply and design a resilient system to maintain a reliable supply of clean water. Prairie's 23-member Future City Team worked with Mr. Brubaker and Ms. Baskas to research, plan, design, and build a futuristic city that met the requirements of the challenge.

The all-day Regional Illinois (Chicago) Competition was held on January 18, 2020 at the University of Illinois at Chicago. The PJH Team received the "Best Virtual City" award, the "Peer" award, and achieved a 1st Place ranking. This accomplishment meant that the Team was headed to compete in the 2020 National Finals in Washington, D.C. on February 15th-18th.

At the 2020 Finals in DC, students presented their innovative city ideas and solutions to adult engineers and listened to business leaders who spoke about how contemporary inventions will shape lives in the future. The Prairie Future City Team placed 13th out of 43 participating teams! They were inspired by the real-world connections they experienced with adults working in their fields as well as other middle school students from all over the country; however, spending time with family/friends, eating, swimming, sightseeing, and making new friends was at the top of their list!!!
