## Halloween Trick-or-Treating 2020 Guidance

Like so many activities and events that have changed this year because of the coronavirus pandemic, Alsip families can expect Halloween 2020 to look a bit different as well. This year, the Village has approved a plan to accommodate a safe Halloween experience for both participants and non-participants.

Trick-or-treating in Alsip is from 1-6 p.m. on Saturday, October 31 and those who ARE welcoming trick-or-treaters are asked to leave their **porch lights on** to indicate they are participating.

The following are the proposed recommendations to be-utilized during this years' celebration:

- The Village of Alsip is asking residents who choose to participate to post this **Village-created sign** on their door and leave their porch lights on to signify that you are welcoming Trick-or-Treaters. This sign, can be printed from the Village's **website** or picked up at Village Hall. You can also get one at the Alsip Park Dist. or Alsip-Marionette Park Library during normal business hours.
- We ask that Trick-or-Treaters, as well as homeowners, consider wearing an appropriate COVID-19 mask when interacting with each other.
- Please do not leave bowls of candy outside for multiple people to touch.
- The Cook County Health Department is very concerned about large gatherings taking place. Please consider this when making your plans.

## VILLAGE POLICIES:

Halloween is established as Saturday, October 31, 2020.

"Trick or treat" activities will be permitted only on Saturday, October 31 between the hours of 1:00 - 6:00 p.m. only.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS FOR PARENTS:**

- 1. Dress children in light colored garments and give them flashlights to carry if they are out after dark.
- 2. Remind children about watching for traffic on streets, crossing only at corners.
- 3. Advise children not to eat any unwrapped candies and bring all fresh fruits, etc. home for inspection.
- 4. If children must walk on streets, ask them to walk facing the oncoming traffic. Do not walk down the middle of the street or in groups across the whole street.
- 5. Tell children not to accept rides from strangers.
- 6. Tell children never to enter a strangers home, wait outside for tricks or treats.
- 7. Adults driving during trick or treat hours should drive much slower than posted limits.
