Village of Alsip Residents,

The predicted upcoming weather could reach 100-degree temperatures coupled with high heat indexes, as temperatures are expected to soar into the upper 90s through Friday evening. Unfortunately, the sunset won't bring much relief.

The Alsip Village Hall is located at 4500 W 123rd Street, and is available for those who may want to sit in an air-conditioned facility from 9am-4pm in the Village Boardroom.

These extreme temperatures bring with them the increased risk for heat-related health issues and I'm asking our residents to please check on elderly and disabled friends and neighbors to make sure they're safe and comfortable.

High temperatures and humidity can lead to dehydration, heat exhaustion or heat stroke. The risk is higher for the elderly or those with preexisting health conditions.

Those who need a place to escape the heat should come to the Village Hall and if someone needs help, call and let us know. Additionally, health officials are urging people to limit strenuous outdoor activities and wear loose fitting clothing.
